# 1. Project Instruments

## Policy Briefs for 2018/2019 around the topics of:

- The adequacy of the Paris outcome in the context of the broader climate regime complex
- Energy security
- Technology innovation

### *Other topics to consider:*

- Identify cross-cutting themes across WPs
- Technology development, government orchestrators, finance and investment transitions
- Briefs by sectors that provide tangible governance recommendations (e.g. international transport)



# 1. Project Instruments

## Input into the Talanoa Dialogue

- A publication that gathers together the key messages from the core themes of the project, following the halfway point of the project
- This would be a joint work of the RIPPLES consortium to inform the facilitative *Talanoa Dialogue*, lead by IDDRI with contributions from different partners.
- Aim for publication around September, before the deadline of submissions to the *Talanoa Dialogue*: **29<sup>th</sup> October 2018**

## Special Issue

- Special issue in Climate Policy (Climate Strategies connection) or somewhere else (e.g. the Cambridge University Press)
- Would encourage open access of SI for wider coverage
- What topics would you like to see covered in an SI?



# 1. Project Instruments

## Policy Dialogues

- Suggest a restructuring of the order of policy dialogues across 2018/2019 to provide opportunity for targeted outreach for each years' outputs
- **PD 1 [2018]** – Originally scheduled for Brussels in March 2019 (M29) but propose to move this to late 2018, held in Poland. The PD would focus on core topics of:
  - How to increase ambition of current NDCs
  - Eastern European focused-dialogue (topic tbd)
- **PD 2 [2019]** - Scheduled for November 2019 (M36) as an official UNFCCC side event. Propose to move this earlier in 2019 to either **Brussels** or **Bonn** depending on which would be a more impactful opportunity (will monitor the landscape). Themes tbd
- COP side events (COP24 and COP25)

## Workshops

- **Final workshop in Brussels** – Scheduled for 2019

- European Commission Decarbonisation Workshop (February 2018)
- Annual International Studies Association (ISA2018) Conference in San Francisco (April 2018)
- Earth System Governance Conference in Utrecht (5-8 November 2018)

- WTO; UN SDG; Green Weeks; Climate Week; Global Climate Action Summit (formal and informal processes)
- Will any of these sessions be timely opportunity for presenting our work?

## Areas to Consider:

- Other opportunities to present outputs during 2019? (Bonn SBs, COP, Green Week) – timetable for 2019
- Advice on events + other types of interventions (e.g. Coal Transitions project interaction with the cabinets of EU commissioners) – e.g. consultation meeting with UNFCCC?
